Re: 1632 Associates, LLC (Visual Arts Center) - Conditional Use Traffic Review 1632 West Chester Pike Westtown Township, Chester County

Mr. Hatton:

As requested, the following materials have been reviewed for compliance with applicable sections of the Westtown Township Code, as well as reasonable and customary standards for Traffic Engineering practice:

 <u>Conditional Use Plan</u>, prepared by InLand Design, dated January 16, 2023 (sheets 1 and 4 only)

The applicant is proposing to develop a Visual Arts Center (2,750 sf) within the southwest quadrant of West Chester Pike (SR 0003) and Green Lane (TR 432). Vehicular access is proposed to West Chester Pike via a right-in/right-out driveway and Green Lane via a full movement driveway. There are no provisions for pedestrian access.

The following comments are offered for the Township's consideration:

- 1. \$170-209D(1)(h) Provide a traffic statement demonstrating that the additional traffic associated with the development does not add to congestion or create a hazard. It is recommended that the statement include:
 - a. Assessments of driveway sight distance.
 - b. Capacity Analysis of the site driveways and the intersection of West Chester Pike/Green Lane.
 - c. Turn lane warrant analysis for the West Chester Pike driveway and the intersection of West Chester Pike/Green Lane.
 - d. An evaluation of the Hilltop Road median break and recommendations on modifications to physically restrict U-turns from westbound West Chester Pike, if warranted.
- 2. Additional information should be provided regarding the materials anticipated to be presented on the digital display to ensure that it will not create a hazard for traffic along West Chester Pike.



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- 3. Consideration should be given to:
 - a. Sidewalks along the site frontages.
 - b. Facilities supporting the existing bus stop (Route 104) along the site frontage.
 - c. An accessible crossing of Green Lane.
- 4. The stormwater modifications adjacent to West Chester Pike immediately west of the subject property appear to make the roadside drop-off steeper than existing conditions. Consideration should be given to design alternatives that reduce the roadside drop-off and minimize or eliminate the need for a guiderail.
- The work within the State Right-of-Way, including the proposed driveway drainage modifications and guiderail adjustments, will require a PennDOT Highway Occupancy Permit.
