Subject: Historical Marker for "Huey Homestead"

Action Requested:

Approval for purchase and installation of an historical roadside marker for the Huey Homestead/Ruins on Township property at S. New St. and General Howe Dr.

Discussion:

Several years ago, at the urging of the WTHC, the Township purchased the parcel of land containing the ruins of the Huey Homestead on the west side of S. New St. The Township then expended additional funds to remove vegetation and stabilize the ruins. Permission was granted for archaeological students from West Chester Univ. to study the site; artifacts were found representing several different centuries of use and occupation by Native Americans and Colonial settlers.


However, to date, there is no explanatory signage at the Huey Homestead ruins. The WTHC recommends that this years *budgeted* historical marker be placed here.

Attached find the wording approved by the WTHC, a map showing the proposed location (final placement to be determined in consultation with the Roadmaster), and a quote from Sewah Studios for \$2,240 (marker budgeted for 2024 at \$2,500.) Sewah manufactured the marker placed last year at the Revolutionary War Militia monument on S. Concord Rd. Note: 6 months delivery would allow for a Fall installation if ordered promptly.

HUEY HOMESTEAD

In 1730, William and Jane Huey, immigrants from Ireland and Wales, purchased 125 acres surrounding this site. They were among the earliest settlers of Westtown Township. As yeoman farmers, the family operated a small "plantation" before selling out to a neighbor, Richard Strode, in 1822. Typical of settlers in the area, the Hueys maintained a self-sufficient operation, raising dairy and beef cows, hogs, sheep, planting grain crops, and making cheese. The stone ruins here are believed to be of their two-story homestead, built over a natural spring used to cool foodstuffs. Archaeological research by West Chester University uncovered artifacts showing evidence of Lenape use of the spring long before the Huey's arrival. This site is now owned and conserved by Westtown Township.

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
